

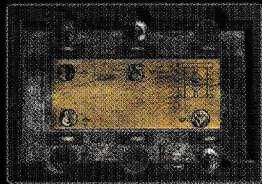

Introduction

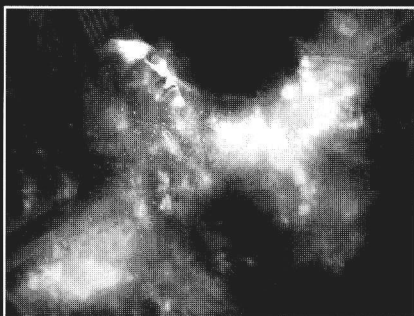
He did not envision that I would rescue Mina, and miraculously escape with both her and the Dragon Ring.

Install/Uninstall Instructions

It is recommended that you close all non-essential programs before beginning the installation of any software on your computer. This includes anti-virus software, which may interfere with the installation procedure.

Windows 95/98/ME

1. Insert CD 1 into your CD-ROM drive.

If the 'Auto run' mode on your computer is active, the installation starts automatically when you insert the CD in the drive. Follow the on-screen instructions.

If 'Auto run' on your computer is disabled, input the following:

- a) At the Windows desktop, click on the 'Start' button.
- b) Select 'Run' and type the letter of your CD-ROM drive, and install.exe, i.e. d:\install.exe. Follow the on-screen instructions.

2. The installer will then indicate that it will install DirectX 7.

Note: The game will not install over files unnecessarily and will only install DirectX if you do not have DirectX installed on your machine or do not have version 7 or later. Once again, follow the on-screen instructions.

3. To launch the game, at the Windows desktop, select:

Start -> Programs -> Dracula - The Last Sanctuary -> Dracula - The Last Sanctuary.

Uninstall Instructions

To uninstall 'Dracula - The Last Sanctuary,' complete the following actions:

At the Windows desktop, select Start -> Programs -> Dracula - The Last Sanctuary -> Uninstall Dracula - The Last Sanctuary.

Macintosh

1. Insert CD 1 into your CD-ROM drive.
2. Double-click on the Dracula - The Last Sanctuary CD icon to open the contents of the CD.
3. Double-click on 'Dracula - The Last Sanctuary Install.' Follow the on-screen instructions. When you are advised that installation was successful, select 'Quit.'
4. To launch the game, double-click on the 'Dracula - The Last Sanctuary' folder on your hard drive, then double-click on the 'Dracula - The Last Sanctuary' icon.

Uninstall Instructions

To uninstall 'Dracula - The Last Sanctuary,' complete the following actions:

1. Single-click on the 'Dracula - The Last Sanctuary' folder, select 'File,' then select 'Move to Trash.'
2. From the Main Menu at the top of the screen, select 'Special,' then select 'Empty Trash.'

Main Menu

Each time you start to play 'Dracula - The Last Sanctuary,' the Main Menu will appear.

Press the 'Esc' key to access the Main Menu at any time during game play.

From the Main Menu, you have the opportunity to start a new game, load a previously saved game, save your current game, or quit (exit) out of the game.

New Game

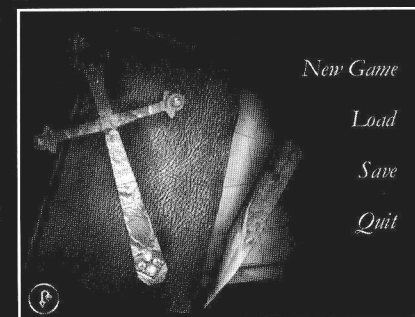
To start a new game, select 'New Game.'

Load

To return to a previously saved game, select 'Load.' You will be taken to the saved game menu.

Select the image of the saved game you wish to load by clicking on the image.

To leave the screen without loading a saved game, select the 'Return' icon at the bottom of the screen.



Save

(To save your game during game play, press 'Esc' to access the Main Menu.)

At the Main Menu, select 'Save.'

To save your game in progress, select one of the available spaces.

You may replace a saved game by clicking on the picture of a previously saved game.

To leave the screen without loading the game, select the 'Return' icon at the bottom of the screen.

We suggest that you save often.

Note: When you choose to save or load a game, the cursor rests on the Save or Load button for a moment before the save or load menu appears.

Quit

Select 'Quit' to exit out of the game.



Cursor Definitions



Neutral Cursor:

No action is possible.

Arrow Cursor:

Indicates a direction the player may take.

Denied Access Cursor:

Indicates a possible direction the player may take but not at this time.

Return Cursor:

Indicates you may back away from a scene or return to the previous menu or screen.

Hand Cursor:

Indicates that the player may place an item in inventory.

Inventory Cursor:

Indicates that the player must use an inventory item in this area of gameplay.

Active Inventory Cursor:

Indicates that the player has selected the correct inventory item for use in this area of gameplay.

Inactive Inventory Cursor:

Indicates that the player may not use this inventory item for use in this area of gameplay or not at this time.

Action Cursor:

This cursor indicates that an automatic action will occur, and no inventory item is necessary.

Examine Cursor:

Allows you to zoom in on a scene for a close-up view.

Gameplay Icon Definitions



Empty Dialog Icon

Indicates there will be a dialog possible but that you need a certain item first.*



Dialog Icon

Indicates a dialog is possible about this subject.



Discussed Dialog Icon

Indicates the player has heard the dialog for this subject.



Rotation Icons

Allows the player to turn or rotate items to the left or right during gameplay.



Plus and Minus Icons

Allows the player to add or subtract numbers or values during gameplay.

* Please note: At Dracula's Castle, in the cannon alcove, there are three empty dialog squares. These squares, in this one instance during gameplay, act as a place to combine items to create the necessary combination to shoot the cannon.

Shortcut Keys

General movement, picking up of an object, etc.

PC - Left Mouse Button

Macintosh - Mouse Button

Access the Inventory Menu

PC - Right Mouse Button

Macintosh - 'Control' key + Mouse Button

Access the Main Menu

PC - 'Esc'

Macintosh - 'Esc'

Stop an animated scene and continue to the next area of gameplay.

PC - Space Bar

Macintosh - Space Bar

Inventory

Placing an Object Into Inventory:

If your cursor turns into a hand, click on the object, and it will automatically be placed in the inventory.

Accessing the Inventory Menu:

PC – click the right mouse button

Macintosh – press the 'Control' key + click the mouse button

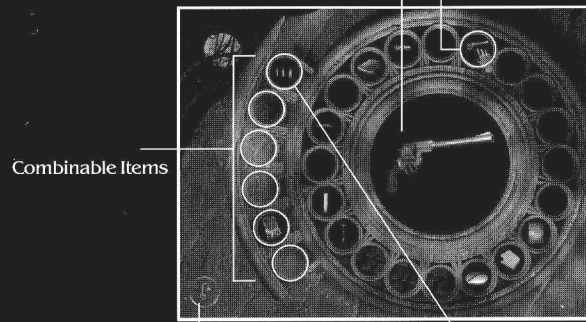
When you access the inventory, all the items you have picked up appear. If you hover your cursor on an item, it appears zoomed in on the center of the rosette.

Click on the item you want to pick up. You automatically return to the game. Once back in gameplay, if the item is circled green, this means you have

chosen the right item. Click on it to place it into the game and continue your gameplay.

Click on a combinable item and click on the item in the inventory. The two items will combine in the rosette if a combination is possible. Click on the combined item shown in the rosette to use it in gameplay.

The combinable item will disappear from its slot if it is not combinable with any other inventory item.
